May 2018

Westway Place

Mace intend to keep residents informed of upcoming construction works during the development of Westway Place.

Hours of work Monday-Friday: 7.30am to 6pm Saturday: 8am to 1pm

Works continuing from April 2018 include:

- Internal conversion of Elms Court, to be handed over to Tesco in late May / early June
- Preparation of the temporary Lloyds Pharmacy relocation, with trading expected to commence in mid June

Works commencing in May 2018 include:

- Part demolition of the Grant Thornton building (*from 14 May*)
- Soft strip of the vacant retail units in the Shopping Centre (*throughout May*), ahead of demolition
- Handover of temporary premises for Botley Baptist Church (*from 21 May*) and Seacourt Hall (*shortly thereafter, subject to final discussions*)

Demolition of the units currently occupied by businesses / groups that are moving will take place after the temporary premises are operational. We anticipate the demolition of the existing Botley Baptist Church and Seacourt Hall will take place in early June, and the current Tesco and Iceland stores will close in mid June. The dates of these demolitions and closures will be communicated closer to the time.



